



Clothes

As with all of the activity sheets discuss the pictures, language and communication are key.

Ask questions such as:

What is this piece of clothing called?

What colour is it?

Do you have a?

When do you wear it?

What season can you wear this in?

Does yours look like this, or is it different? How so?

Then cut out the pieces, they can be used in whichever way your child enjoys using them, below are some ideas as to how they can be used to develop fine motor skills.

- Print them in black and white, if you would like to use as an arts and crafts activity and colour and decorate each of the items of clothing.
- Use them to dress drawings, or people you have cut from a magazine.
- Hang a piece of string or elastic between two chair legs to make a washing line. Use pegs to role play laundry day and hanging the washing out to dry. Or a clothes rail to role play a clothes shop.
- Decorate an old cardboard box and use the pages at the end of this printout to create a clothes shop. Use string, wool or elastic to make the rails and sellotape a bent paperclip to the pack of each garment to make a hangar.

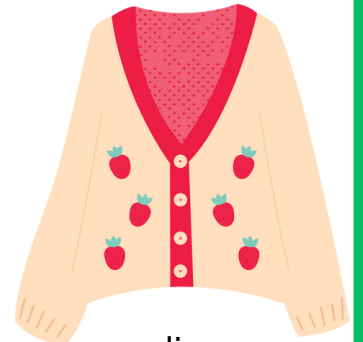

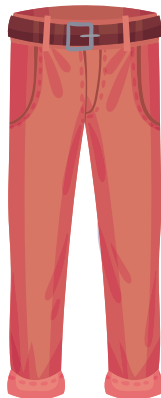
