



# Line Tracing

Before you begin decorating, discuss the activity, language and communication are key.

Ask your child:

What do you think we have to do?

How could we decorate it?

What do we have that we could use?

What colours can we use?

- Ask your child if they can follow the lines with their fingers.
- You can also place the sheets in a poly pocket and use a non permanent marker to trace the lines to practice before using a mark making tool.
- Using pens, pencils, crayons or paint follow the lines.
- Using paper, tissue, stickers, newspaper or play dough balls follow the lines.
- Glue pasta, wool, pipe cleaners, buttons or pom poms onto the lines.
- Create a mosaic using different colored paper.
- You can also use these sheets to practice using scissors.
- Ultimately, its all about getting little fingers moving and developing hand eye co-ordination.


